Carl Brun was appointed to the Board in 2014 by Governor Kasich. He is a Professor of Social Work at Wright State University (WSU). Carl has his BA in social work from the University of Dayton (1981), MA in Social Work from the University of Chicago (1983), and his PhD in Social Work from The Ohio State University (1993). He worked in mental health and child welfare for ten years in Dayton, Ohio and Chicago before beginning his teaching position at Wright State University in 1993. He is an Ohio Licensed Independent Social Worker – Supervisor (LISW-S). He was chair of the WSU Social Work Department for eleven years and is the current director of the Greater Miami Valley Joint MASW program, which is a collaborative program between WSU and Miami University. The MASW program began in 2012 and is fully accredited with the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE). Carl teaches primarily in the areas of research and evaluation, social welfare policy, and cultural competency. He has participated in over twenty program evaluations funded at the local, state, and federal levels. He has written a book entitled, *A Practical Guide to Evaluation* (2014, 2nd edition), that utilizes his experiences to help other social service workers and students develop and implement program evaluation. He is also a site visitor for CSWE. He is an avid jogger and bicyclists. He rides 12.5 miles one-way to WSU, even in December.
