1. New Business

- a. The committee reviewed requests for licensing examination.

2. Director’s Report to the Committee

- a. Discussed Senate Bill 213 and its relative impact on the ability of MFTs to diagnose and treat clients.
- b. The Executive Director, along with Assistant Attorney General P.R. Casey, informed the committee about the proposed changes to 4757-5-03 in the Rules and Laws regarding multiple relationship conflicts.
 - i. Mr. Trivison mentioned inclusion of specific wording in the law to reflect the responsibility of the therapist to keep continuing documentation of ongoing multiple relationship conflicts.
- c. The MFTPSC recommended to the Executive Director that the Consumer Bill of Rights contain a specific notation regarding cultural diversity and background.
